So how can a person SO famous around the world become almost forgotten? I say almost because there is now a growing force to relight the 'Corelli Flame', especially in her adopted and beloved Stratford-upon-Avon.



Tonight we will talk about Marie's time in Stratford, how she both endeared herself to the locals and managed to upset (quite spectacularly) some very powerful local dignitaries'. How she and her friend and life partner Bertha Vyver, the Victorian 'little and large' illuminated a sleepy old market town attracting hundreds of people everyday. They came to catch a glimpse of these two celebrities riding in a chaise being pulled by a pair of Shetland ponies, or enjoying a gondola ride on the Avon, and accepting the love and admiration of an adoring public.
